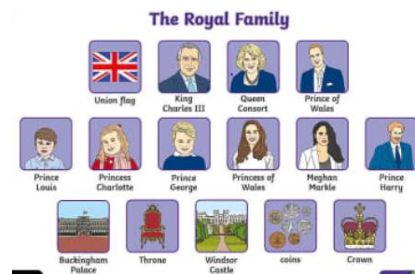
Finding out about Kings and Queens of the past

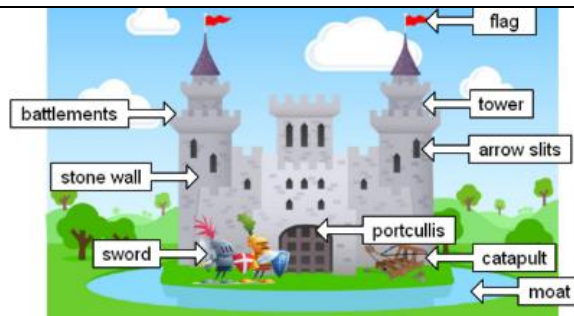

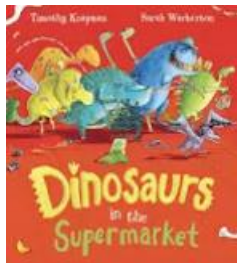
