SATs & Testing

- Key Stage 2 (Year 6) SATs take place during week commencing 13th May
- Multiplication checks for Y4 (2 weeks, commencing 3rd June)
- Phonics screening for YR, w/c 10th June

It is important that children are in school for these tests.

KS1 SATs are no longer statutory. From 2024, they are now optional. We will continue to report teacher assessments as normal in end of year reports.

Punctuality

We understand that occasionally something unavoidable happens to make us late. However, regular late arrival to school causes disruption to children's education and to the smooth-running of the school day. We ask all parents to ensure their children arrive in time for the school day, as class learning starts promptly at 8.45 am.

Also, regular late collection at the end of the school day means that teachers sometimes miss important input at staff meetings etc.
