SATs & Testing

Please make a note in your diaries as it is important that children are in school for these tests:-

Key Stage 2 [Year 6] SATs take during week commencing Monday, 12th May 2025.

Phonics Screening—week commencing 9th June 2025

Multiplication Tables Check within the two week period from Monday, 2nd June.

Punctuality

We understand that occasionally something unavoidable happens to make us late. However, regular late arrival to school causes disruption to children's education and to the smooth-running of the school day.

We ask all parents to ensure their children arrive promptly and in time for the school day to commence at 8.35 am. Arriving five minutes late everyday equates to more than three school days of lost learning.

Also, regular late collection at the end of the school day means that teachers sometimes miss important input at staff meetings etc.

A reminder:

- We require a week's notice (whenever possible) of any appointments your child has during school time. Please complete a form (available from the office) if your child will be attending dental/medical/other appointments. We ask to see a notification of the appointment.
- We cannot authorise any holiday requests unless they are deemed as 'exceptional circumstances' or meet the Department for Education criteria.

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LOCAL COMMUNITY PARKING

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that we can help children feel better and get back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over
